Summary

Update on CDOT's work to develop a major update to the statewide Active Transportation Plan.

Background

CDOT's statewide Active Transportation Plan sets goals, policy recommendations, and action steps supporting walking, bicycling and human-powered transportation for all Coloradans. The plan will integrate with local and regional bicycle and pedestrian plans (including DRCOG's Active Transportation Plan, which is currently in development), as well as other statewide planning initiatives. While CDOT's Active Transportation Plan is creating a tool to prioritize active transportation investments on the state highway system, it is not a project-based plan.

Building on feedback received both from the general public and from a Community Advisory Committee of more than fifty public and private stakeholders and partners, the CDOT Active Transportation Plan has created the Priority Active Connections Explorer—or PACE Tool—to assess and prioritize active transportation investments on the state highway system using fourteen data factors in four goal areas (Safety, Equity, Mobility Choice, and Connected Communities). The PACE Tool is intended as an interactive, map-based platform to score and prioritize road segments across the state and provide guidance both to CDOT and local agency partners to assess network priority segments and gaps for improvement.

CDOT staff will provide a comprehensive update on the statewide Active Transportation Plan, including the process to date, an introduction to the PACE Tool, and next steps for providing feedback on the draft plan.
