

Save time and money when traveling to Red Rocks by setting up a carpool with other concertgoers near you. If you've ever taken an Uber or Lyft, you can carpool — it just takes a few clicks or taps!



Getting started is easy! First, create an account on MyWayToGo.org. When setting up your account, select **Red Rocks Park and Amphitheatre** as your network, then confirm your account via email.




Once you're logged in, click


Events > View Events in the
top menu. Find the event you're
attending and click on View Event

Details.



Enter your starting location, an intersection near you or a public landmark where you'd like to meet other carpoolers. Click **Let's Go!** to see your matches.








Check the menu to confirm details and the time you'd like to start your carpool. If it's all correct, select **Save this Commute**.

The next menu will allow you to enter extra details, such as if you're open to driving, riding or both. At the bottom under



Additional Options, select


Specific Networks from the "Share this trip with" menu and enter **Red Rocks Park and Amphitheatre** in the network match field.






Once you've saved your commute, refresh the page to see others in your area who are carpooling to the same event.

You'll have the option to connect with them by sending a message through the MyWayToGo network. If they reply to your message, it will be sent to your email. All communication from this point will happen outside of the MyWayToGo platform.





Congratulations! You're on your way to setting up a carpool.

Now what? Follow these tips for a successful carpool ride:

- Exchange information. You'll already have your fellow carpooler's email address, but feel free to share additional information like social media accounts or phone numbers.
- Plan a pickup or meeting location.
 Choose a location where both parties are comfortable meeting.
- Set ground rules. Communicate about who's driving and if there are additional people joining your carpool.

- Determine costs. Carpooling is cheaper than taking an Uber, so be considerate of your fellow carpooler and offer to split the costs of the trip.
- Ask for proof of license and insurance information. Find safety in your carpooling experience by asking about these items upfront.
- Tell others. Keep friends and family in the loop with information about who you'll be carpooling with, and consider sharing your phone's location, too.
