Incentives and advising update

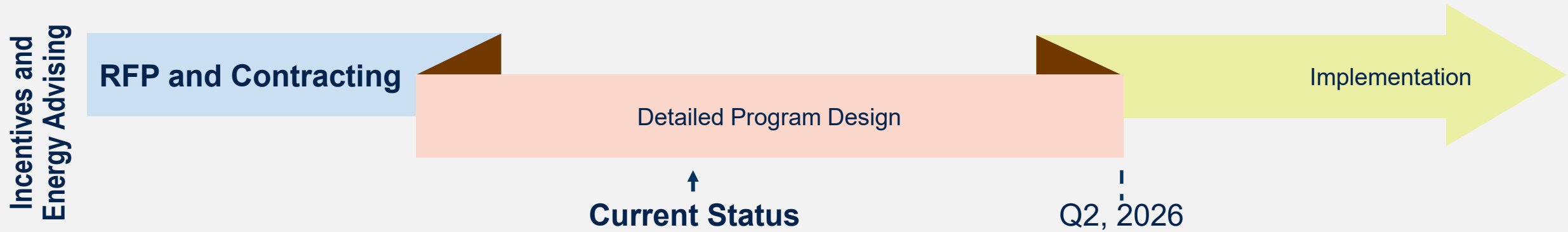
Incentives and energy advising (\$59.6 million)

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- Support customers in choosing **cold climate heat pumps** and similar highly efficient all-electric technologies.
- A **benefit to HVAC contractors**, businesses and workforce.
- **Support customers** in making easy, informed decisions.



Program Timelines





Approach to incentives

Cold Climate Heat Pumps, Heat Pump Water Heaters, and Rooftop Units are initial priority.

- Incentives to end-customers (**downstream**) for targeted incentives and larger, custom projects.
- Bonus incentives to installing **contractors** to support consistent quality bids to customers and advanced commissioning.
- Incentives to distributors (**midstream**) to consistently support the region.

Approach to energy advising

Based on customer needs, no-wrong-door approach

- **Tier 0:** Web-based educational content
- **Tier 1:** Concierge-level support to inform customers and answer broad questions
- **Tier 2:** Higher level of service for customers with more needs, may engage specific technical experts as needed
- **Tier 3:** Expert technical support, may include on-site support as needed

Innovation Program Update

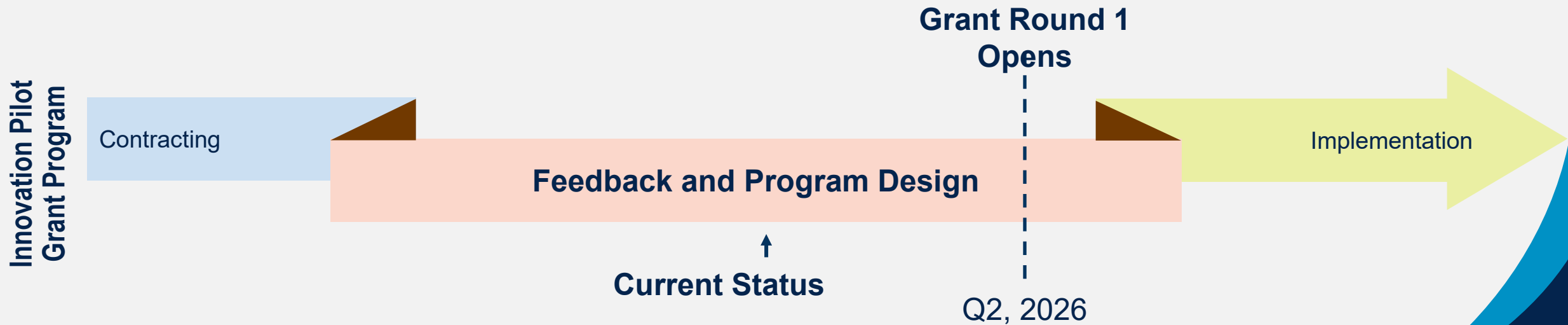
DRCOG innovation pilot program (\$6 Million)

- Award an average of **\$200,000 per subaward** to entrepreneurial businesses, technologies, community-based organizations with high potential to accelerate electrification and energy efficiency adoption and bust barriers to service delivery.
 - Demonstrate scalable solutions to key market barriers via regional pilot projects.
 - Inform decarbonization decision-making with public data, analyses, and case studies.
- Target small businesses, novel approaches and community-driven innovations
- Technical Committee will participate in grant criteria development and award selection process.



Focus tracks and timeline for Round 1 funding

1. Reducing market friction and soft-costs
2. Technical and grid optimization
3. Access and Health
